COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS OF GENDER-SPECIFIC CHARACTERISTICS IN ENGLISH AND UZBEK LINGUOCULTURAL DISCOURSES

Abstract. This article presents a comparative analysis of gender characteristics in English and Uzbek languages, focusing on the description of women and men in artistic discourse. Primary attention is paid to identifying the linguacultural features of each language, demonstrated through examples of complex words and expressions. The study underscores how language can reflect and shape gender perceptions in different cultural contexts.

Annotatsiya: Ushbu maqolada ingliz va o'zbek tillarida gender xususiyatlarining qiyosiy tahlili berilgan bo'lib, badiiy nutqda ayollar va erkaklar tasviriga e'tibor qaratilgan. Har bir tilning lingvomadaniy xususiyatlarini aniqlashga asosiy e'tibor qaratiladi, murakkab so'z va iboralar misollari orqali namoyon bo'ladi. Tadqiqotda tilning turli madaniy kontekstlarda gender tushunchalarini qanday aks ettirish va shakllantirish mumkinligi yoritib berilgan.

Relevance. The analysis of gender in Uzbek artistic discourse is increasingly relevant, reflecting the global interest in gender studies within social sciences. This field offers insights into cultural and literary representations of gender roles and stereotypes, particularly vital in today's diverse world.

Uzbek culture and literature present a unique area for gender linguoculturology research. Language's role in depicting gender relations is crucial for understanding the socio-cultural dynamics in Uzbek society, especially amidst its evolving cultural landscape.

Early 20th-century linguists initiated gender studies, which grew significantly in the 1960s. This research, viewing gender as both a natural and social construct, has significantly contributed to linguoculturology and anthropocentric language studies.

Gender is seen in scientific discourse as both a mental and social construct, making its study essential in modern linguistics. Analyzing gender in Uzbek artistic discourse not only sheds light on linguistic use but also helps in accurately translating texts, contributing to the understanding of Uzbek culture and society.

This theme is integral to exploring the interplay between language and culture, opening new avenues in literary studies and fostering intercultural dialogue in today's globalized context.

Materials and Methodology. The study on gender characteristics in Uzbek artistic discourse utilized a broad selection of literary works across various styles and genres, focusing on authors like M. Osim, Shuhrat, S. Siyoev, and S. Karomatov for an in-depth view of the topic.

Methodologically, the research employed content analysis to spot gender-specific lexemes, emphasizing the contextual and semantic examination of words and phrases linked to gender. Comparative analysis with other languages was integral, helping to distinguish unique and shared gender markers. This included linguistic scrutiny of Uzbek's grammatical and morphological traits concerning gender.

Historical-cultural analysis was crucial, exploring the impact of historical and cultural elements on gender portrayal in Uzbek literature. Tools like lexicographic databases, corpus analysis software, and qualitative literary methods aided this research.

The approach encompassed selecting texts, thematic exploration, and deep dives into semantics and context, enhancing the understanding of gender-related language use. This multi-dimensional strategy allowed a thorough investigation of gender aspects in Uzbek literary expression.

Results and discussion. The analysis of gender characteristics characterizing the appearance of women in English and Uzbek languages allows for the identification of interesting linguocultural features of both languages. Below are examples of complex words and expressions used to describe the appearance of women in the artistic discourse of both languages, as well as some observations about the predominance of positive and negative assessments of appearance.

In English: blue-stocking – (an educated woman who is interested in serious subjects. (MAC. p. 150)); damsel-fly – (a young beautiful girl); demi-rep – (a woman who is on the fringe of respectable society. (AS Hornby OALD of Current English. Volume I p. 229)); good-looker – (physically attractive, especially with an attract in face. MAC. p. 650).

In this group, along with the description of a positive assessment of appearance, there is also a predominance of the description of a negative assessment of a woman's appearance using complex words in English.

As for the Uzbek language, the main attention in describing a positive assessment is paid to her appearance.

For example: dilnavoz – (Muloyim, dilnavoz sadolar uning (Yalchining) butun tomirlaridan hordig'ini sug'urganday bo'ldi. (Oybek, "Tanlangan asarlar", 615-6)).

The analysis of gender-specific characteristics describing the male character in the artistic discourse of English and Uzbek languages reveals intriguing linguocultural traits of both linguistic systems. Provided below are instances of complex words and expressions used to portray the male character in both languages' artistic discourse, accompanied by observations regarding the prevalence of positive and negative assessments of male character traits.

In English: bad-tempered – (someone who easily becomes annoyed or angry. (MAC. p. 97)); bitter-end – (a man who stands firmly until the end of a particular situation or period of time, even if it is difficult or unpleasant. (MAC. p. 137)); bold-face - (without feelings of shame, immodest. (AS Hornby OALD of Current English. Volume I p. 93).

Conclusions.

This research not only emphasizes the unique aspects of gender portrayal in Uzbek literary language but also deepens the understanding of the cultural and societal influences behind these representations. The findings pave the way for further studies in gender linguistics and cultural analysis, offering insights into linguistic patterns across various cultures.
